

Guidelines for Race Entries, Scoring, Bike Numbering

Womza Race Regulations Motocross 2018 Refers

Race Entry:

All riders that pre-entered must also report to documentation on race day. Bring your Womza license to documentation. No entries even persons who pre-entered will be accommodated after riders briefing. Riders briefing is the cut-off for entries. If you are late or did not report for documentation you will not be allowed on the track.

All fields on the entry form must be completed.

Womza Rule MXRR36 ENTRIES

For an entry to be valid, a completed entry form must be with the organizer by the closing date, payment for entries must be made when competitors submit entries.

The following must be properly filled in to be scored.

1. License number
2. Bike number
3. Bike make and capacity
4. To which club you belong

If you ride in two classes, please complete two separate entry forms. (Payment can be one payment). If any of the above information is missing you will not be scored. Results will show "No Score".

Numbers

If your bike number on the entry form is different from the number on your bike, you will not be scored. Results will show "No Score". I will no longer walk around to find people, to sort out numbers.

If you buy a new bike or change your bike during a race day, and the number differ from your entered number please inform me before the start of the heat.

Womza Rule: MXRR6. NUMBERS

Numbers on all machines must have three number plates, one on the front and one on each side at the rear where they can be clearly seen. They must be elliptical or rectangular in shape and measuring 270mm x 240mm, and the space between any two numbers shall be 10mm.

The minimum dimensions of the numbers must be:

Height: 155mm

Width: 73mm

Stroke Width: 25mm

MXRR6.1. All number plates fitted to the machine must be of a rigid material and must be solidly constructed.

MXRR6.2. Any other number plate or marking on the motorcycle that might be confused with the number must be removed before the competitor is allowed to start.

MXRR6.3. The minimum dimensions of the numbers must be for:

50cc - minimum of 75mm high, 15mm stroke and spacing

65cc - minimum of 100mm high, 20mm stroke and spacing

85cc - minimum of 150mm high, 25mm stroke and spacing

Numbers 1 to 10 will be allocated for all classes as per the 2018 Championship results.

COLOUR OF NUMBERS

All front and side numbers must be black on a white background and be made of a durable vinyl material. Series championship leaders may run with a front board carrying a red background. The class leader may carry a red background after the 1st round of the National championship is completed and may retain this red background, providing he maintains the lead in the championship in that class, in the event a new leader takes over after proceeding championships rounds, this must then be passed on to the leader. Please refer to MXRR8.2 below.

MXRR8. ALLOCATION OF NUMBERS

Numbers are only allocated by WOMZA office and may only be reserved via e-mail no telephonic numbers will be allocated. Numbers are only confirmed once e-mail is received from WOMZA office. Should a competitor remain in the class from the previous year he/she is entitled to keep his number as reserved, however should the competitor move to a different class he must 1st confirm whether the number he was using in the previous class is available.

MXRR8.2 Numbers 1 to 10 will be reserved for competitors who are competing in the same class the following year according to their final standing in the National series, and thereafter from number 11 – 999. Riders who have competed in a class in the previous year will have first option to retain their number.

MXRR8.3 Numbers will then be issued to the remainder on a first come, first served basis.

MXRR8.4 Any competitor changing from one class to another must ensure that he has a number that is correctly allocated in the new class.

MXRR8.5 Only numbers allocated by WOMZA will be permitted. In any dispute the number allocated by WOMZA will be deemed to be the correct number.

Protest Period

Womza Rule MXRR38 PROTEST PERIOD

The protest periods for motocross shall be 15 minutes after the results have been posted on the official notice board for the practice, qualifying, 1st, 2nd and 3rd heats. The results sheets must be time marked as to what time they are put onto the notice board.

In the right hand bottom corner of the results a time is printed. And the 15 minute protest period will start from the time indicated on the score sheets.

To all riders, fathers, mothers and whoever is interested in you results. You must bring the discrepancies under my attention within the 15 minute protest period. After the 15 minute protest period no queries will be entertained. At the end of the race day after the COC had signed off on the results no results will be changed. Results will stay as is, and will be moved as is to the Regional Championship points.

MXRR40 - Responsibility of Competitors and Relatives

Each competitor is responsible for the actions of his family and pit crew. Consumption of alcohol in the pits or in the circuit area is strictly forbidden and any unnecessary trouble caused by these individuals may result in the exclusion of the competitor concerned for the day. Each competitor is responsible for the actions, acts or omissions of any and all of his or her supporters, irrespective of the title under which they attend such events. Any undesirable act, which is in the opinion of the Clerk of the Course and/or the Stewards of the meeting of such a nature as to bring the sport into disrepute, will be punishable by the exclusion of the competitor for the day or for a period not exceeding 2 months. This applies to 1st offences only and does not preclude WOMZA from instituting any further action it deems necessary. The competitor's representative will also be the responsible person to lodge any queries, protests and appeals on behalf of the competitor. No competitor may enter into an event if alcohol has been consumed. No competitor or Pit Crew member may consume alcohol until 15 minutes after their final results have been posted on the notice board.

MXRR 40.1 Any person who attends an event and throws any object at a competitor whilst on the race circuit and by so doing, endangering the competitors, will be subject to a life ban from attending or participating in any WOMZA sanctioned events.

MXRR 40.2 Any person who becomes involved in any physical encounter of any description will be banned for a period of 1 year from attending or participating in any WOMZA sanctioned event. This can be extended to a life ban, depending on the circumstances, particularly if a weapon was used in the encounter or unruly behaviour.

MXRR 40.3 Any person being involved in verbal abuse of any kind will lose their points for the day and will not be permitted to continue racing for the rest of the day. In the event that this is not a competitor, he or she may be liable for a 3 month ban from attending any WOMZA sanctioned events.

MXRR40.5 The responsible person, parent/guardian/team manager (with written consent from the legal guardian of a minor), who enters a minor under the age of 18 years into a race event, will be considered to be the responsible person. This individual will be responsible for the minor's well-being for the day and also the only person who can protest on the minor's behalf.

MXRR40.6 In the event that the minor license holder commits any of the above offences they will then be dealt with under the provisions of MXRR40.
